3. What is the NCAA, NAIA, and NJCAA?
4. Academic eligibility and specific international student requirements
5. Taking the SAT or ACT Test
6. Timetable for high school juniors and seniors (ages 15-17)
7. Writing a Letter of Introduction and a Golf Resume
8. Creating a Videotape
9. Registering with the NCAA Clearinghouse - if necessary
